## Animal Farm Assignment(s): Choose 3:

1.1 drawing: $2 / 3$ of the paper is an accurately detailed drawing. You need a minimum of eight sentences analyzing one of the following: physical description, thoughts, words, actions, setting, verbal interactions (impressions/inferences), physical interactions, similarities with other character(s). Cite quotes using MLA format.
2. Create a 10 -question, multiple-choice exam.
-Label the questions difficulty (low, med., high) and the type of question (concrete/RT, abstract/TS, and provide an answer key
3. Quote identification: For three characters, find three quote that best identifies his/her character. Cite quotes using MLA format. Identify whether the quote is direct or indirect/implied/inferred. Cite the speaker and page. Please write two or three sentences explaining the significance of the quote.
4. Vocabulary: Create a 10 -word, multiple-choice vocabulary test. Consider synonyms, antonyms, use in sentences, or other, more creative ideas. Provide an answer key
5. Identify one plot shift. Give a hypothesis as to its function in the play. Explain an effect on a characters' thoughts and/or actions (micro). Consider tone and mood shifts on the play as a whole (macro). Minimum ten sentences.
6. Identify two examples of ethos, logos and pathos, for a total of 6 examples, and explain their function in the story (characterization, conflict, etc.) (2-4 sentences for each)
7. Identify five examples of logical fallacies: who used them why they were used, and their effectiveness. (3-5 sentences/each)
8. Identify and evaluate the 3 effective examples of syntax (loose, periodic, anaphora, epistrophe, anadiplosis, parallelism, juxtaposition, etc..) Short answer responses 4-8 sentences.
9. Identify proverbs/aphorisms and evaluate why they are used (who, where, when). Short answer responses 4-8 sentences.
10. Graphic organizer: Map a timeline, line graph, of 5 conflicts and solutions.
11. Identify 5 examples of figurative language (symbols, allegories, motifs, hyperbole, irony, satire, etc..) and evaluate. Short answer responses 4-6 sentences/each.
